Ordinary Time

The season of Easter ended on the Feast of Pentecost.

The disciples, gifted with and by the Holy Spirit, now set out on the mission given to them by Jesus: to share the Good News with all whom they knew and met.

As we move from the season of Easter, we must take on this same mission with the gifts given to us by the Holy Spirit.

We will bear much fruit in our lives if we are true to ourselves as people created by God for a great purpose.

The gift of courage gives us the strength to be faithful to God's call and God's love – provided that we accept the gift!



The colour for ordinary time is Green. It is the colour of growth.

Ordinary time is a time of growth after the experience of Easter.

Today's Gospel is about growth!



Jesus speaks to the disciples in **PARABLES** (stories with a message about God).

Everyone loves a story!

We learn from stories.

Most of the parables are about animals (sheep, shepherds, goats...) or about plants (wheat, weeds, mustard...) because most of the people were shepherds, farmers or fishermen.

Jesus uses the images of nature to explain God and God's kingdom to us.

We hear two parables this week:

The Parable of the Growing Seed

The Parable of the Mustard Seed

Jesus said:

The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how.



**Every time we share
Good News of God's love
we spread the seeds of
God's kingdom!
God's love grows when
we share it!**

The earth produces of itself, first the stalk, then the head, then the full grain in the head. But when the grain is ripe, at once he goes in with his sickle, because the harvest has come.'



When we share God's love and message with others, it will take time for the message to find a home in the heart of other people and in our homes!

Jesus also said, 'With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it?'



It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade.'

SEEING YOUR LIFE THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPELS

Mark 4:26-34

- 1** If you sow seeds, or watch plants grow, you have ample opportunities to pause in wonder at the whole process of growth. It takes place imperceptibly and comes to fruition in beautiful flowers, majestic trees and abundant harvests.
- 2** Jesus uses this as a parable about the growth of the Kingdom of God, the kingdom of right relationships with God and with one another. There too growth is slow, development is imperceptible, and then without realising it you have a mature relationship. Recall the stages of such development in your life and relationships, and give thanks.
- 3** In the second parable Jesus invites us to reflect on the importance and significance of relationships in our lives as they grow and mature. This is true both of our relationship with God and with others around us. When have you found a relationship in which you could 'make nests in its shade'?
