### Signs of Growth



Just as a small seed lies hidden in the darkness and spurts forth, we are also seeing encouraging signs of new life, of growth, in the Lord's Harvest. For many years now, we have become used to diminishing numbers of men entering seminary. We are now seeing that trend beginning to reverse.

#### **10 Men Ordained to the Priesthood**

In 2023 there were ten ordinations to the priesthood for Irish Dioceses.

#### **15 Men Enter Seminary**

This year according to a survey conducted by the **Irish Catholic Newspaper**, 15 men have entered diocesan seminary for Irish Dioceses. The majority of these entering Maynooth. This number is up on 2022.

#### **15 Men Commence Propaedeutic Year**

The Catholic Communications Office report that this academic year 15 men will commence a propaedeutic year in Spain. Again, an increase on the number from the previous years. According to the CCO, this brings the total number of men at various stages of formation to 64.

In November, the National Office in collaboration with the Seminary Formation Team in Maynooth held a Come and See Weekend in our National Seminary. No doubt some of the 35 who attended may be part of the 15 that are planning to commence their propaedeutic year in Spain.

The numbers are encouraging. Despite the general perception that some have about vocations, this is a sign that the Lord still calls men to follow him, and that there are those out there in our parishes who hear His voice in their hearts and are prepared to "Take the Risk For Christ".

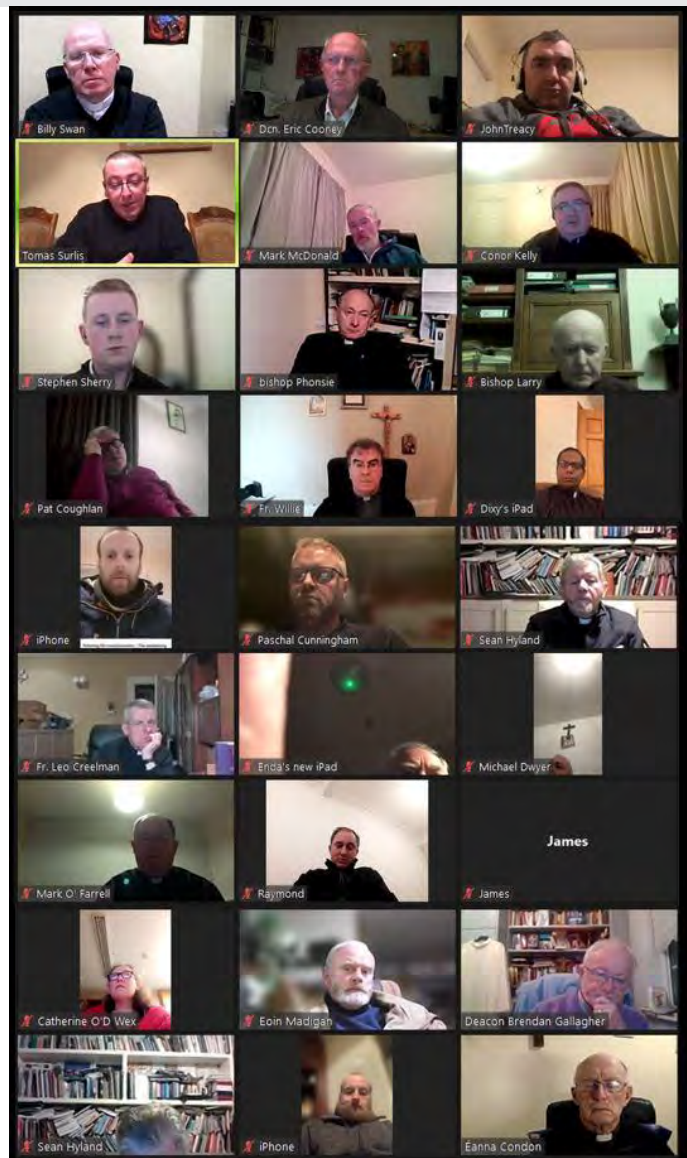
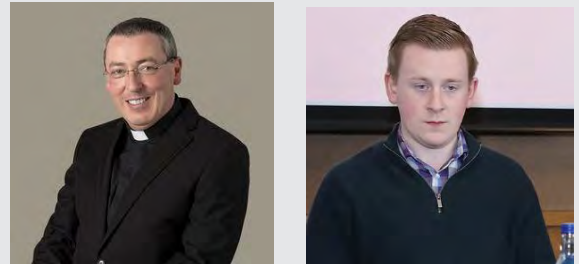

**We are extremely grateful to the formation team and the seminarians who made themselves available to welcome and interact with those attending.**

In total, we had 35 men attend, at one stage we had applications from 42 men, but due to work and family commitments a small number had to withdraw. All of these men, with one exception were in accompaniment with their diocesan vocation directors. The feedback from the weekend was very positive. For many they were greatly encouraged to meet and interact with others who were also discerning a vocation and having the opportunity to visit the seminary, meet seminarians and the formation team was very worthwhile. It was also very encouraging to the existing seminarians to know that there are others who are seriously discerning to follow in their path.

The commitment and dedication of our diocesan vocations directors was evident in this year's come and see event. Those who attended commented not only on the encouragement that their vocations directors give them but also the spiritual leadership in helping them discern a vocation to the Diocesan Priesthood. This work is ongoing and demands great dedication from our vocation's directors who while ministering in many other areas of priesthood continue to encourage dedicated men to take the risk for Christ.







## QUEENS UNIVERSITY CHAPLAINCY

### Vocations Evening

**On Tuesday 21st November, the Chaplaincy of Queens University, Belfast, organised a Vocations Evening. It began at 6 pm with a Holy Hour led by Bishop Cullinan.**

**This was followed by a meal and then a Panel Discussion chaired by Bishop Cullinan.**

The panel comprised the Vocations Director for Down and Connor Diocese, Fr. Conor McGrath, Fr. Thomas McGlynn, local parish priest, Fr. Dominic McGrattan, Queens University Chaplain, Fr. Martin Mayerhoffer, European Chaplain for FOCUS International Theological Institute, Vienna and Deacon Brett Lockhart KC, retired barrister, family man and permanent deacon, spoke with plenty of interaction from the 30 men in attendance.

It is clear that the University Chaplaincy in Belfast has a very lively apostolate with students.

Bishop Tony Farquhar who had died only a few days previously was fondly remembered. Bishop Farquhar who was, himself, a former Chaplain in QUB, may he rest in peace. May he intercede for many vocations to the priesthood in the future.

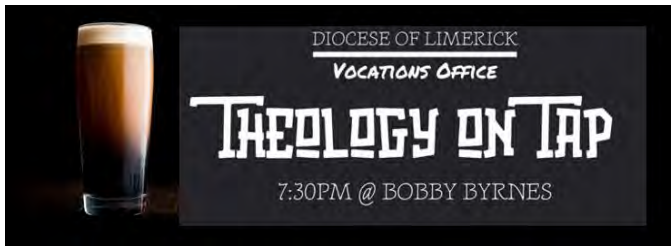

## LIMERICK DIOCESE

### DAILY INTENTIONS

- Day 1:** For Pope Francis, our Bishops, Priests and Deacons, that through joyful and enthusiastic service of God's People they will attract others to follow Christ
- Day 2:** For Parents and Grandparents that through word and example they will be witnesses to the Joy of the Gospel & encourage their children & grandchildren to consider lives of service in the Church
- Day 3:** For Teachers in our schools and for leaders of young people in the community that they will encourage a culture of vocation and service
- Day 4:** For all involved in various ministries in the Church that they will through their service lead others to lives of discipleship and faithfulness to the Gospel
- Day 5:** For those discerning a vocation that they will discern their true calling with the support of the Church community
- Day 6:** For all the Baptised that they will be conscious of their responsibility to pray and be promoters of vocations
- Day 7:** For seminarians and all preparing for priesthood that they will persevere with God's help and the support of the People of God
- Day 8:** For those involved in the ministry of formation that they will accompany all candidates leading them to discern God's path for them
- Day 9:** For all our young people that they will come to know Jesus Christ and have the courage to use their gifts in the service of Christ and His people.

### DAILY REFLECTIONS

- Day 1:** "For this has always been God's dream: that we should live with him in a communion of love."
- Day 2:** "We were created by love, for love and with love, and we are made for love."
- Day 3:** "God's call to the gift of self tends to make itself known gradually: in our encounter with situations of poverty, in moments of prayer, when we see a clear witness to the Gospel, or read something that opens our minds."
- Day 4:** "The gift of vocation is like a divine seed that springs up in the soil of our existence, opens our hearts to God and to others, so that we can share with them the treasure we ourselves have found."
- Day 5:** "There is no vocation without mission. There is no happiness and full self-realisation unless we offer others the new life that we have found."
- Day 6:** "This missionary activity does not arise simply from our own abilities, plans and projects, nor from our sheer willpower or our efforts to practice the virtues; it is the result of a profound experience in the company of Jesus."
- Day 7:** "The Twelve were people from different social classes and trades; none of them was a person of influence."
- Day 8:** "Within the Church, all of us are servants, in accordance with the variety of our vocations, charisms and ministries."
- Day 9:** "Viewed in this light, the Church is a vocational 'symphony'; with every vocation united yet distinct, in harmony and joined together in 'going forth' to radiate throughout the world the new life of the kingdom of God."

## 9 DAY NOVENA FOR VOCATIONS

### Archdiocese of Dublin

As an initiative to encourage prayer for Vocations, the vocations team in Dublin (Fr Seamus McEntee and Fr Bill O'Shaughnessy) have designed a leaflet and compiled prayers for a nine-day Novena. The Novena can be prayed during or at the end of Mass and the enclosed leaflets have been distributed to parishes to help parishioners.

Alternatively, the Novena could be prayed during Adoration or individually at home or offered to a prayer group such as St. Joseph's Young Priests Society.

No specific dates have been chosen to start or finish the novena on, giving parishes and individuals the option to decide on a date to suit parish or individual needs. However, they suggest you could choose a feast day that has a connection with priesthood

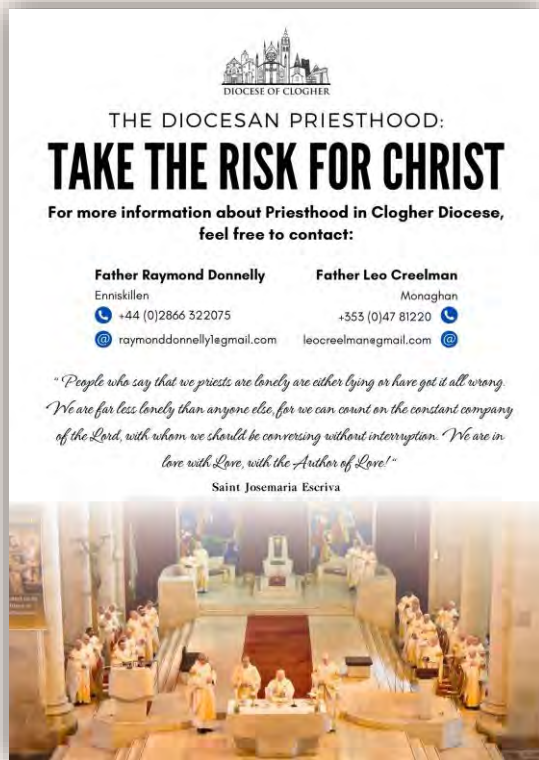

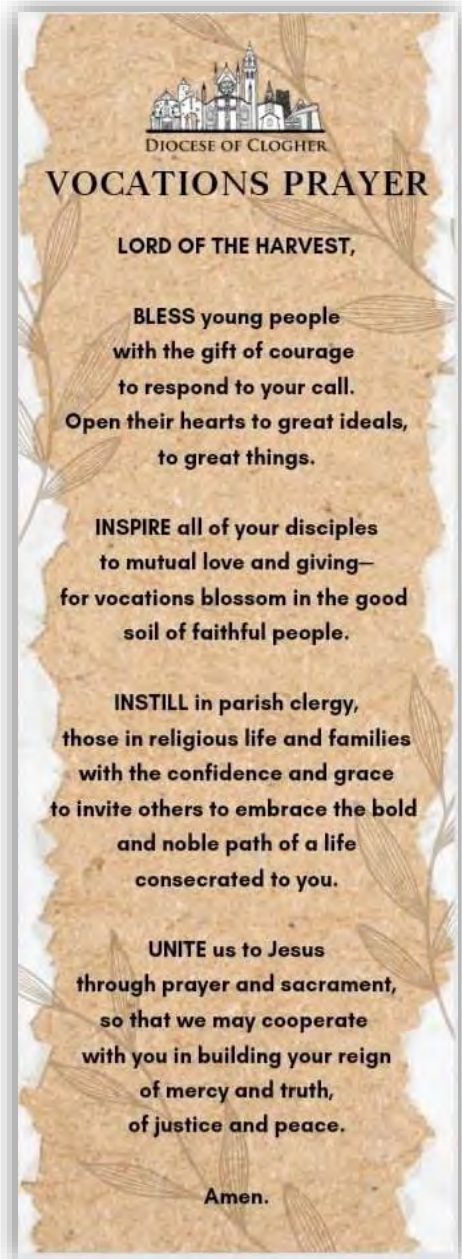
### New Poster

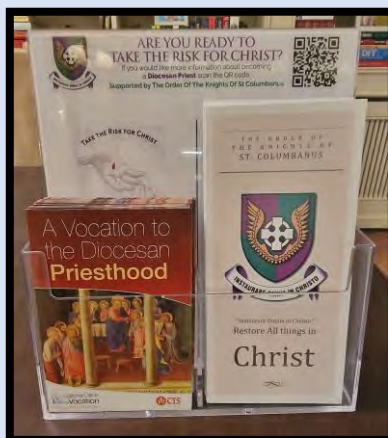
### Launch of Vocations Prayer Card in Advent

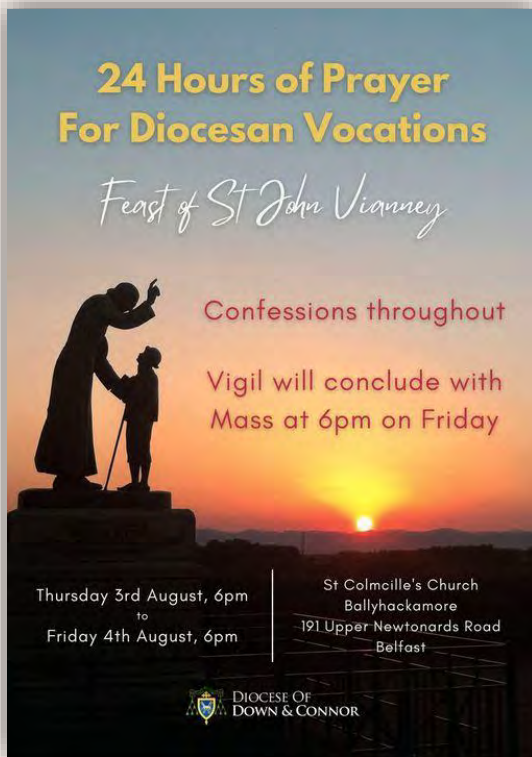
The Knights of St Columbanus have developed a **Vocations Leaflet Display** for churches in Ulster.



Let us offer this decade for those who are being called, but doubt that they have much to offer. May they trust in the power of God to bring all things to completion and say "yes" to His call.

### 3rd Luminous Mystery

*The Proclamation of the Kingdom*

Our Lord begins His public ministry by announcing the arrival of the Kingdom of God. What joyous news this is for all humanity to hear! Let us offer this decade for an increase in vocations that there might be many more priests and religious who will proclaim this truth and bear witness to it with their lives.

### 4th Luminous Mystery

*The Transfiguration*

Jesus strengthened the faith of His Apostles by allowing His divinity to be momentarily perceived. He wished them to gain a supernatural perspective on His forthcoming Passion and Death. Let us offer this decade for all those who are being called as priests and religious that they may have the grace to recognise God's call in the midst of life and courageously accept carrying the Cross.

### 5th Luminous Mystery

*The Institution of the Holy Eucharist*

The gift of the Most Holy Eucharist is a mystery beyond our ability to fully comprehend. Our Lord's abiding Presence in the Blessed Sacrament, the saving mystery of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass – the world would suffer a great loss without these miracles. Jesus gives Himself in the Holy Eucharist through the ministry of His priests. Let us offer this decade for more priests for our diocese. 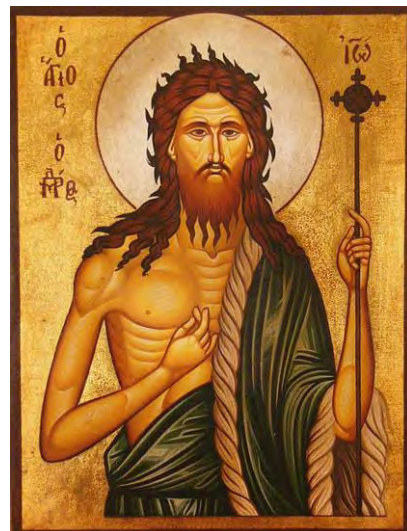


# Scripture Themed Intercessions for Vocations for Advent

## *First Sunday of Advent*

*December 3, 2023*

In our first reading the Prophet Isaiah tells us *“And yet, Lord, you are our Father; we the clay, you the potter, we are all the work of your hand.”* We pray that those whom the Lord is calling to serve as a priest, deacon or religious will discern to submit their lives into the hand of the Lord, that like clay in the potter’s hand, God will form them into worthy ministers of his Gospel.



## *Second Sunday of Advent*

*December 10, 2023*

In our Gospel today, we hear how St. John the Baptist was called to be a messenger, *“a voice that cries in the wilderness”*. We pray for those whom the Lord is calling to be his voice, serving as a priest, deacon or religious, that they will hear his call and have the courage to answer.

## *Third Sunday of Advent*

*December 17, 2023*

In today’s letter from St. Paul to the church in Thessalonica, St. Paul encourages them to pray constantly and assures them; *“God has called you and he will not fail you.”* We pray for those whom God is calling to live their lives in service of the Gospel as a priest, deacon or religious, that they may hear God’s call in their hearts and know that God will not fail them.



## *Fourth Sunday of Advent*

*December 24, 2023*

We pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, the Diaconate and Religious life. We hear in today’s Gospel, that Mary, despite being deeply disturbed – she responded in trust by responding *“Let what you have said be done unto me”* – We pray that those who are being called by God may have the same trust as Mary and respond to God’s call – Let what you have said be done to me.
